Warranty and Reservations

This product, when purchased and registered with *LOWE*®, will carry a warranty against materials and defects for a period of one year from the date of owner's purchase, subject to the exclusions noted. Replacement parts will be warranted for the balance of the applicable warranty period. A warranty form is included in this manual. It must be completed, signed, and mailed to *LOWE*® by either the selling dealer or the purchaser.

It does not apply to products subject to misuse, service other than normal, damage in transit or handling, normal wear, bent or broken metal, or products which in the opinion of *LOWE®* have had unauthorized alterations or repair. Any claims for incidental or consequential damages are hereby disclaimed and excluded from this warranty.

LOWE® will replace any warrantable parts with original LOWE® parts. LOWE® will not pay for freight, excessive labor charges, travel time, or mileage connected with the repair. LOWE® will also not pay for third party repair or replacement charges.

All claimed defective parts must be returned to LOWE®, freight prepaid, in accordance with the official LOWE® return policy in effect as of the date of the claim.







Replacement Safety Decals

Worn, damaged, or missing safety labels should be replaced. New labels may be obtained from $LOWE^{\circledR}$. Labels are listed above with specific part numbers.





Safe Operation:

Are you a safe operator? Consider the following:

- Have you received proper training for the task at hand?
- Do you understand the written instructions and safety labeling?
- Did you check the rules and regulations at your work site?
- Do you know the location of any underground utilities?
- Will you keep other people away from the work area?
- Do you know the weight and characteristics of the material you are handling?
- Will you make certain you stay away from excessive slopes that cause tipping?
- Are you wearing proper work clothing and safety equipment?
- Are you free of the influence of drugs or alcohol?
- Are you free from the use of prescription drugs that affect safe operation?

Obligations and Usage:

This product is intended to be used only under the guidelines of this manual and relevant literature published by $LOWE^{\circ}$. It is the owner and/or operator's obligation to ensure this product is operated only for its intended uses. Operation contrary to the guidelines set forth may cause breakage of the equipment and create serious safety issues.

III ATTACHMENT SETUP

Your new grapple comes completely assembled from the factory. Once the auxiliary attachment hoses and couplers are installed, the grapple is ready for operation.

However, some items may become loose during shipping or use. The following checklist should be thoroughly completed each time before the grapple is used.



Shut off power, relieve hydraulic pressure, and disconnect auxiliary hoses before inspection.

1	The loader and grapple mounting interface is properly secured and all levers and/or pins are properly locked into proper position.
2	The two attachment hoses that run from the loader's auxiliary connections to the grapple are tight and secure. Make certain the hoses are long enough to operate within the full range of movement allowed by the loader's arms.
3	Ensure that all hoses, fittings, and couplers are fully tightened to avoid leaks.
4	All nuts, bolts, and other hardware are tightened securely.
5	All controls operate freely and in the correct manner.
6	The operator has been trained in the proper operation of the grapple.

IV MOUNTING INSTRUCTIONS

In addition to the information contained in this manual, your loader's Operator's Manual should contain information on how to correctly install attachments on that particular machine. Consult that manual as well to make certain you fully understand how to correctly and safely install the attachment.

- Connect the grapple to your loader's attachment mounting system.
 Make certain that all pins and/or levers are fully secured and locked into position.
- 2. Connect the two attachment hoses to the loader's auxiliary system and tighten securely. Inspect to ensure there is enough hose length to allow necessary operation of the loader's arms.
- 3. Test the operation of the grapple for necessary freedom of movement and safe operation.
- 4. Carry attached grapple as low as possible and begin work.

Removing the grapple from the loader:

- L. Roll the loader's arms back and lower the grapple to the ground.
- 2. Stop the loader's engine.
- 3. Using instructions found in the loader's manual, relieve the pressure in the loader's auxiliary hydraulic system.
- 4. Disconnect the auxiliary hydraulic hoses and couple them together to eliminate contamination. Keep the hoses away from the loader and grapple.
- 5. Release the grapple from the loader by opening the locking levers or pins on the loader's attachment mounting plate.
- 6. Start the loader's engine, tilt the attachment mounting plate slightly forward, and slowly back the loader out of the attachment until it is free from the loader.

V OPERATION

This grapple is intended for use in grabbing and removing loose material from a particular location. It is not intended for digging, prying, pushing, pulling, or other operations that may cause damage or safety concerns.

The grapple is designed to open and load the work material, then use the hydraulic cylinders to securely close on the material. In the closed position, the operator can then transport the work material to another location.

Once at the disposal location, the operator may roll the grapple forward in a dump position, open the grapple, and release the loaded work material into the desired place.



Never dump a load over an obstruction. The loader may tip forward and the obstruction may enter the operator's cab. This may cause serious injury or death.



Avoid tipping. Do not exceed the base machine's rated operating lift capacity and do not operate on side hills or sloping ground where the machine does not have a firm, stable base.



Carry the grapple in a lowered position at all possible times. Raise grapple only as much as needed to dump the grapple's load.



Leaking hydraulic fluid under pressure can penetrate skin or damage eyes. Such leaks may not be visible. Never use a bare hand to find leaks and always wear safety goggles for eye protection. If injected into the skin, such fluid must be removed within a few hours by a doctor familiar with this type of injury.

VI TROUBLESHOOTING



Shut off power, relieve hydraulic pressure, and disconnect auxiliary hoses before servicing.

open of close	Contamination blocking flow restrictor.	auxiliary hydraulic fl ow. Remove hoses and check for blockage.	
Jerky	Cold oil or air in lines. Loader hydraulic pump or system.	Give time to warm up. See loader's manual.	
Slow	Restriction in lines, couplers, or system. Loader hydraulic pump. Loader hydraulic oil filter. Contamination blocking fl ow restrictor.	Check with pressure and fl ow gauge. See loader dealer for service. Remove hoses and check for blockage.	
Lack of clamping power	Loader hydraulic pump and pressure. Excessive load. Loader relief valve weak.	See loader dealer for service. Reduce size of load. Check for proper hydraulic pressure.	
Wrong direction	Auxiliary hoses reversed.	Re-install properly.	
Hydraulic oil leaks	Loose fittings or couplers. Damaged hydraulic hoses.	Tighten or replace as required. Replace as needed.	
Leaking cylinders	Excessive system pressure. Worn or damaged cylinder seals. Hydraulic fittings.	Check system pressure. Lower if needed. Replace cylinder or cylinder seals. Tighten o replace as needed.	



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VII MAINTENANCE





Shut off power, relieve hydraulic pressure, and disconnect auxiliary hoses before performing maintenance.

Your LOWE® grapple requires very little maintenance. However, performing these very few maintenance steps will result in safer and better performance, as well as longer equipment life.

Maintenance Required	Length of Operation	Type of Maintenance
Lubricate pins	Every full work day.	Use grease gun to lubricate grease fittings (8).
Inspect hoses, fittings, and cylinders	Every full work day.	Check and tighten all fittings, couplers, and adapters.
Inspect attachment mounting areas	Every use.	Check mounting holes, flange, and welds for bends, wear, and damage. Repair as needed.
